

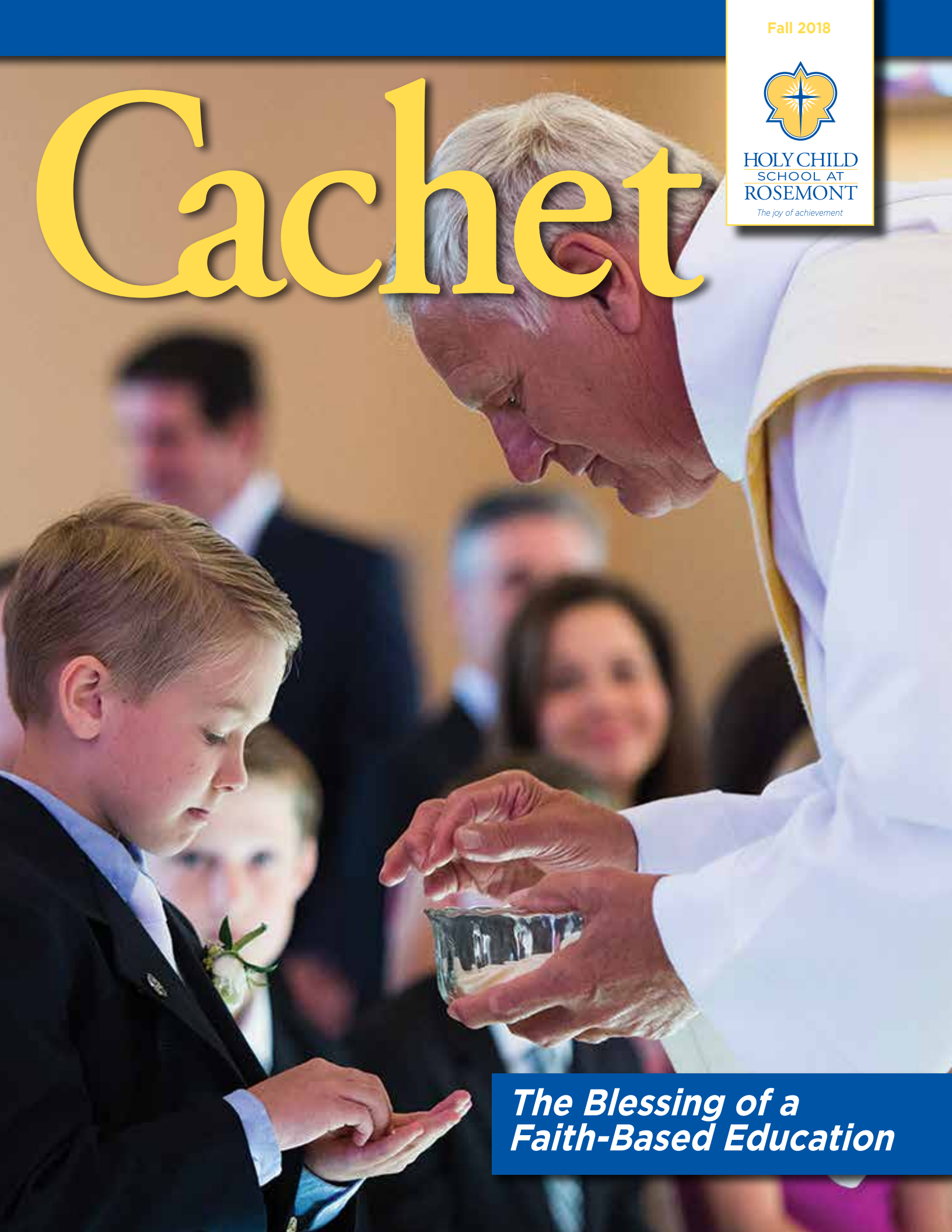

A MESSAGE FROM TOM LENGEL

Preparing Our Students to Live Out Their Faith

Q: “WHO MADE ME?”

A: “GOD MADE ME.”

Q: “WHY DID GOD MAKE ME?”

A: “TO LOVE HIM AND TO SERVE HIM.”

I am old enough to recall those parts of the *Baltimore Catechism* that I learned in Sunday school in the 1960s. In that era, memorizing information and prayers was the key to instruction in the faith, and truthfully, to instruction in most subjects.

There was clearly some value to creating a common language among Catholics and instructing them in knowledge of the Catholic faith tradition. Missing from that approach, however, was an emphasis on understanding the faith, not just knowing/memorizing it.

This edition of our *Cachet* magazine highlights the faith-based nature of our curriculum and overall program at Holy Child School at Rosemont. In ways both subtle and significant, we try to inculcate in our children not just knowledge of their faith, but a true understanding of the mystery of God and his Incarnation when he was born of the Virgin Mary “and became man.” In Early Childhood, that instruction manifests itself in giving thanks and praying for friends and family, and before meals and snacks. In Lower School—in addition to preparing the children in grade two for the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion—we do teach the children the Our Father and Hail Mary (now in Spanish as well!) and other tenets of our faith. This teaching of religion—including an appreciation for other world religions—continues in Middle School and blossoms there. As the students learn about the civil rights movement in the United States, or the Holocaust, they are challenged to respond to those and current issues of racism or unfair uses of power from the context of their faith.

In a safe environment, with teachers and peers who know and love them, each student grapples with fundamental issues of identity and moral development. It is that depth of study and the call for our students to apply their values and faith to their daily lives here at School, and in their neighborhoods, teams, and families, that makes the education here so very important and impactful. In their “Actions Not Words,” we challenge our students, while they are here and throughout the rest of their lives, to live and reflect the Gospel values they have learned and hopefully embraced.

One of those values of course is charity. The Annual Report, included with this edition of *Cachet*, speaks clearly and convincingly to the generosity of our Holy Child community. On behalf of the faculty and staff here, and especially on behalf of our children, I thank you and am most grateful for your support of this wonderful School. ✚

FAITH is Part of the FABRIC of EVERYTHING WE DO

The education we offer at Holy Child School

at Rosemont respects and honors the four dimensions of every child's life: the intellectual, the spiritual, the physical, and the emotional. As a member of the Admissions team over the past three years, and now as interim Director of Admissions and Marketing, I have the opportunity to see the spiritual aspect in action every day. It is a wonderful thing!

Prospective parents often ask me how religion plays a part in our day-to-day life here. I always explain that it is part of the fabric of everything we do. Our students receive the gift of a faith-based education every day. Some days it might be more prominent, for example a morning prayer service, a Mass, or in our students receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation or First Holy Communion. Other days, faith is seen in smaller, but not less important ways...starting the day off with a prayer, saying Grace at lunch, visiting the Holy Child sisters at New Sharon, working on a service-learning project, or learning a song in music about God. These daily reminders are constantly reinforcing their faith. The first Holy Child goal (shared with all other Holy Child Network of

Schools) and the opening sentence of our Portrait of a Graduate emphasize the importance of our students' faith commitment:

GOAL 1

Faith: Holy Child schools foster a faith commitment that engenders a joyous personal relationship with God in addressing the challenges of the world.

and

A Holy Child graduate is a joyful, faith-filled community member who is guided by a moral compass throughout his or her life.

When you read this issue of *Cachet*, you will see these statements come to life. Faith is an element of our education that the students live out from the time they begin as Young Falcons, to Middle School, to wherever life takes them after Holy Child! ✚

On the morning of September 5, we marked the 70th anniversary of opening our doors to the students of Holy Child School at Rosemont. That means we've celebrated nearly 70 First Holy Communions, almost 70 Masses of the Holy Spirit, and countless student-led prayer services in the Great Hall. That also equals innumerable community service hours worked, prayers learned, memories made, and hearts shaped. While a milestone year might lend itself to quantifying the influence of our education, the most distinctive hallmark of Holy Child is qualitative—the blessing of our faith-based education forever impacts our students and we are continually proud of the legacy it serves.

THE BLESSING OF A Faith-Based Education

Our strong faith-based education is the modern articulation of the timeless teachings of Cornelia Connelly who over 170 years ago founded the Society of the Holy Child Jesus. “Cornelia’s educational philosophy is different from other orders, some of which emphasize structure and discipline, not that we lack those in Holy Child schools, but it’s a kinder, gentler approach to dealing with children,” said Head of School Tom Lengel P’12. “I often quote Cornelia saying that ‘A Holy Child School should feel like a child’s second home.’ Not all religious traditions of teaching orders have that kind of sense and I think that was because Cornelia was a mother herself.”

For over 35 years, Rita Smith P’06’08, Director of Early Childhood and PreKindergarten Teacher, has allowed Cornelia’s words and life to inform her approach to teaching. “Cornelia taught that every child should feel like they’re a member of your family, that you’re teaching your children. I want the children to know that



they’re precious. They excel when they have that confidence, and when we build that confidence in children, we give them the go-ahead to be their best. That’s how we nurture.”

Cornelia’s spirit is alive in the disposition of our teachers, but also in our identity and the way we communicate it to our surrounding community. Three years ago, we changed our name from Rosemont School of the Holy Child to lead with the words “Holy Child.” Said Tom Lengel, “There are many terrific schools within a 5-mile radius of Holy Child School at Rosemont. I have a respect for all of them, but what most distinguishes us is our ‘Holy Childness.’ We are a faith-based school. I find it’s easier to build community where there’s a

common heritage, a common understanding of what we’re about.” While our foundation and core is as a Catholic, independent school, we have always welcomed and celebrated students of all faiths and backgrounds. Our children benefit as much (if not more) from their differences as they do their similarities.

From a very young age, our students truly learn “what we’re about.” Beginning in Early Childhood, “The students start to learn that they’re a part of something bigger than themselves, that God is a part of their world, through everything that’s around them: the flowers, the trees, the Earth, the seasons. Then we bring God into that,” said Rita Smith. “They learn at a young age that they are able to make cards for the sisters at Holy Child Center (a nursing facility for Holy Child sisters) or to extend themselves beyond our community by running Alex’s Lemonade Stand to help other children. So from a young age we’re fostering the values and concepts of peace and justice.”

Each student in Kindergarten through grade 8 has dedicated periods for religion class. While each grade focuses on certain elements of the faith with age-appropriate depth, so much of the religion we teach lives outside of that specific class—in the teachable moments each day brings. “I know our teachers in Lower School remind children to see the face of Jesus in everyone they meet,” said Helen Gambescia P’94’98, Third Grade Teacher, who has been teaching at Holy Child for 30 years. “We also use buddy activities to help our students learn something new about their classmates, to take pride in the gifts God gave each of them, and to treat others with respect and dignity.”

For Steve Clarke '73 P'01'03, a Holy Child graduate who this year celebrates 40 years of teaching and coaching, there is no missed opportunity to share the faith that he himself grew at Holy Child. “Every class for me is religion class, whether it is gym, or social studies, or religion class itself. Everything the children learn comes from a place of spirituality.” Faith is infused not only into the classes Steve teaches, but also on the playing field as well. “There’s a certain spirituality I try to teach them in the team concept. It’s

not just, ‘Let’s be a good football team.’ It’s ‘Let’s be a good group of people working together and caring about each other.’ It’s emphasizing the spirituality aspect of Cornelia Connelly’s ‘Actions Not Words.’”

Outside of class time, Holy Child students take an active role in living and sharing their faith with their teachers and peers. This is seen most clearly in our School-wide assemblies, prayer services, and Masses. “Our liturgies are unique in that students are involved in every aspect of the Mass or prayer service,” said Liturgist and Middle School Religion Teacher Chelsea Wallace. “Our students create the artwork that goes in the programs, write and read petitions and prayers, and lead their fellow classmates in song. In the spirit of Cornelia Connelly, who believed that ‘Confidence begets confidence,’ we help students grow into faith-filled leaders by facilitating opportunities for them to use their gifts within the liturgies.”

Faith in action is also evident in the amount of community service and service learning that is woven into a student’s experience all the way from Young Falcons through grade eight.

As a whole community, students, faculty, and staff serve side-by-side in events such as our Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service or on Service Day. Additionally, each grade participates in service—learning initiatives that allow them not only to embody “Actions Not Words,” but also to learn about the issues and stories surrounding the organizations and people they serve. Young Falcons make placemats at Thanksgiving for the Holy Child sisters, Lower School joins forces and makes Jared Boxes for seriously ill children, and Middle School raises money for causes they have chosen throughout the year, just to name a few examples. Each grade also makes at least one yearly visit to the sisters at New Sharon, engaging with the women who have dedicated their lives to embodying Cornelia’s mission.

In encouraging our students to have a broader worldview through service-learning, empathy ensues—for those outside our community, but also within these walls. “The teachers strive to incorporate Catholic beliefs and the importance of recognizing that everyone should be treated with dignity and respect,” said Jeanne Marie Blair P’96’99’04, Director of Lower School. These lessons help students strengthen their moral compasses and help their best selves to shine through when faced with a challenging circumstance. Added Jeanne



Marie, “We share a common philosophy that allows teachers to offer consistent and loving guidelines that children can reflect upon when deciding on a best course of action.”

In this loving, respectful atmosphere, our children discover their place in the world and the importance of their interconnectedness to others. “The Holy Child approach makes their faith relevant, habitual, and vibrant,” said parent Elizabeth Petrizzo P’19’24’24. “Faith informs all that our children do and gives multidimensional meaning to their work in academics, athletics, arts, and service.

Life with five children adhering as best they can to the core values communicated at Holy

Child certainly serves for an easier journey as we navigate from Early Childhood through Lower School, Middle School, and finally high school.”

While the academic success of our students is a celebrated outcome of the education we offer and a continual point of pride over these past 70 years, the greatest testaments to the success of our education are the character and hearts of the students we graduate.

“As parents, we hope our children nurture a compassionate and empathetic spirit,” shared Helen Kelly. “The core values at Holy Child have brought our children joy, a healthy respect for themselves and others, a moral compass, and above all the strength of character to stand up for these core values. This foundation will serve them beyond their time at Holy Child.” ✚

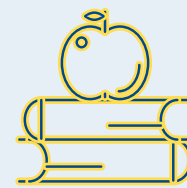

Our Playground Renovation: HELPING OUR STUDENTS “SUSTAIN A BRIGHT AND JOYFUL SPIRIT”

Happy Children Learn Better. At Holy Child we know this to be true. Ask many children what their favorite part of the school day is and they will say recess. This does not deny their engagement and excitement in the classroom, but it speaks to a child’s inherent need for unstructured play. To any passerby, the joy during our recess times is palpable...and joy is a necessary component to the education we provide.

Cornelia Connelly, the foundress of the Society of the Holy Child Jesus, fervently believed that physical play and the practice of self-expression were central—not optional—elements of a holistic approach to the education of children. This is why the education we offer respects and honors the four dimensions of every child’s life: the intellectual, the spiritual, the physical, and the emotional. The physical dimension is definitely found on the field with our sports teams, but it most importantly is present every day on the

playground during our recesses. Early Childhood students have three recesses, Kindergarten and Lower School have a morning and afternoon recess, and Middle School has an afternoon recess in addition to a brief morning break.

Our mission, paired with our vast knowledge of the developmental stages and needs of our children, sparked our playground renovation and, beginning this September, our students have been enjoying our newly installed equipment. This initiative would not have been possible without the generous support of our parents, who, at our 2018 Auction, amassed \$91,000 in donations through our “Raise Your Paddle for the Playground.”

This renovation will ensure that play continues to be a integral part of each student’s day and will help our students to “sustain a bright and joyful spirit” as Cornelia Connelly famously encouraged. ✦

On May 31, thirty-one eighth grade students received their diplomas during Holy Child School at Rosemont's 63rd Commencement Mass, held at St. Thomas of Villanova Rosemont Chapel. WHAT DREW YOU TO TEACHING MUSIC?

I grew up playing the piano and the french horn and was involved in both musical theater and my church choir when I was in middle and high school. I also had always wanted to be a teacher, having loved all of my teachers growing up. Music was just always what I was going to do. I went to college with that plan in mind, but actually dropped my music major a couple of weeks into school not wanting to be confined to a practice room. I took a year off and was involved in a production of *Jesus Christ Superstar*. It changed my life! It made me realize that doing theater was very different than being stuck in a practice room. Honestly, this is my calling. I love work and I love coming to work. It inspires me and challenges me. It’s funny the winding path that I took to get here, because I can’t imagine doing anything else.

WHAT MAKES OUR MUSIC PROGRAM UNIQUE?

For our foundress, Cornelia Connelly, to have believed in the importance of the arts so long ago was very unique for the time that she lived in. Today, our School is still very supportive of the arts. It’s wonderful that we have two full-time music teachers because we then have the opportunity to know each student well, and that’s a gift from the School.

WHAT DOES THE JOY OF ACHIEVEMENT MEAN IN YOUR CLASS?

The Joy of Achievement is most clear in the performances. In the work that we’ve done leading up to a concert, there are a lot of nerves, anticipation, and some frustrations along the way, but in the end the children are standing in front of their peers, teachers, and parents and they are joyful and excited. The performances are the time when the children often feel the most proud about what they’ve achieved because it’s a culmination of all of our work.

HOW WAS YOUR FIRST YEAR WORKING ON OUR MIDDLE SCHOOL PLAY?

I absolutely loved it. It was wonderful for me because the children who are in Middle School right now were 3, 4, 5, and 6 years old when I started at Holy Child and I taught them all until they were in third grade. It’s been a couple of years since I’ve taught the eighth graders, so it was really special to work with them again, to hear their singing voices, and to really watch them shine.

HOW DOES MUSIC CONTRIBUTE TO OUR HOLY CHILD MISSION?

Music is innately joyful and I think that aspect is a big part of our vision and mission statement. When anyone hears a song that they love, it does something to their heart. When the children perform or do work in class, there’s something about singing, playing, and moving that just produces joy. ✚



The Carroll Family: WHY WE ARE A HOLY CHILD FAMILY

For Kevin Carroll and Elizabeth Yao P'16'19'22, their commitment to education has made life a highway... and has been one since son Jonathan enrolled at Holy Child School at Rosemont in 2008.

Kevin and Elizabeth reside in Chester Springs, approximately 25 miles from Holy Child, where no bus service is provided. So Kevin and Elizabeth have shared driving responsibilities from the far-flung western suburbs for 10 years as part of their investment in the futures of Jonathan '16, Anna '19, and Grace '22.

“My mindset is that wherever you find a school that fits the children best and where they are the most happy, you do whatever you can to make that happen,” said Elizabeth. “At this point, it’s just a part of the day. I don’t think about it anymore.”

In the beginning, Elizabeth drove to morning drop-off and afternoon pickup for her threesome...daunting but doable.

After graduating Holy Child, Jonathan enrolled at The Hill School in Pottstown in 2016, wrenching the commute in opposite directions. As a result, they registered Anna and Grace at nearby non-sectarian Wyndcroft School for one year. It was a short-term compromise, and last year the two girls returned to Holy Child.

“The impetus had been, with Jonathan going out to Hill, how to simplify things for ourselves. That is why we left,” Elizabeth added.

The girls “had been happy at Holy Child. They did well at Wyndcroft,” she continued. “But we had wanted a school where the spiritual component was a part of everyday life. The girls loved visiting the sisters, the prayer services. They missed those things.”

After one year, the parents reworked the driving shuttle. “It’s a struggle and it wears on you,” said Kevin. “It’s amazing what you can get used to. I leave about 7:15 in the morning, drop off



the girls, then continue into the city. It’s a long day, but certain things are worth it.”

It was happy returns at Holy Child, too. Last year when the Carrolls returned, fourth grade homeroom mom Erin Cook P'22 sent the family a welcoming voicemail. Head of School Tom Lengel P'12 emailed a personal message.

The touch has been a major foundation of the family’s experience.

“Their teachers had a big impact on Jonathan, and that really helped him prepare for The Hill School,” said Kevin. “Holy Child was very strong in math and the writing instruction was very strong with Mr. (James) Bolden P'19. That was important, because Jonathan spends lot of time on writing.”

“I know that all of our children were lucky enough to have had teachers in both the Lower School and Middle School that took the time to ensure that they were being academically challenged,” said Elizabeth. “Seeing the teachers was one of the things Anna was most happy about in returning to Holy Child!”

“So really the reasons that we continue to live with our somewhat hectic schedule is because Holy Child is able to provide the things that we deem necessary for our children—a private Catholic school where they can experience their faith every day, a school with a strong academic program carried out by equally strong teachers, and an environment that our children are happy in. After all, they spend most of their day at school!” ✚

ASSOCIATE VETERINARIAN



Don't tell Marianne Nardi Linton '79 there are no second acts in life. For her, first acts are often just preludes.

This was evident during Marianne's formative years growing up in Havertown. She was the community nurturer of creatures great and small.

"I wanted to be a veterinarian ever since I was little, and was known for rescuing birds on the street," Marianne said last June from her new home in Auburn, AL.

"We had one cat, the best cat ever. She let me dress her up in doll clothes. She would follow me to a friend's house and would sit waiting for me at the path. She let me drive her around in a stroller. Amazing..."

When the cat passed on at 16, her late mother Mary "was hysterical; she ran outside, crying."

So Marianne followed up by adopting a rabbit - and limits. "I would have had 100 pets if my parents let me. Fortunately," she said with a chuckle, "they talked sense into me. I knew I'd have to pay for them myself."

Marianne's path to being a vet was not direct. She earned a degree in biology from Villanova University, having been advised by counselors that veterinary school was not practical. "But I couldn't do much with an undergraduate degree in biology," she said. After working in the Aston Veterinary Hospital laboratory, "I refocused and realized I had to go to grad school."

Her Holy Child experience, she said, affirmed that "nothing in life is free, and you have to work through things if they're hard. That helps you no matter what you do in life."

Marianne earned her degree from The School of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania in 1996 and became an associate veterinarian.

Today she is associate veterinarian at Fur Buds in Opelika, AL, after her family—husband Mark, who works in sales; and children Sara, 20, Sam, 18, and Adam, 14—relocated last spring. For Marianne, it was career advancement, for Mark, it was the chance to reconnect with his cosmopolitan college town.

"It's a great experience," Marianne said. "The practice has changed because you can do so much more now; there's a specialty for everything, which opens up a whole new world for what's possible. Because of early diagnostics and preventive medicine, pets can live to be 20."

Marianne was a Holy Child lifer, one of 17 students in the Class of 1979, "a place where everybody felt respected for whatever you brought to the table."

"Amazing" teachers, such as the late Dan Algeo P'83'85'90'95 and the late Ed Kowalchick, were lifelong mentors. "Even today, I hear their words in my head, correcting my grammar," Marianne said. "Holy Child was a great community and really the biggest thing was that it made you feel special. You didn't have to be good at everything; you had to be good at something. At that age, you needed to be recognized for your own strengths and not compared to someone else."

JESUIT

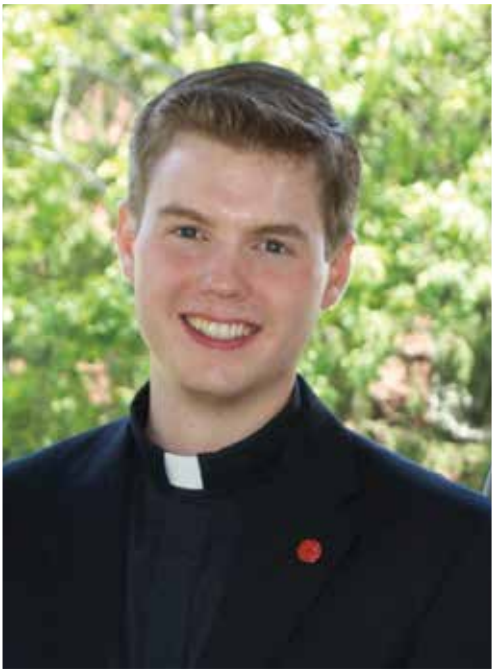


BOSTON, MA

“Go forth and set the world on fire” are the famous words of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuit order. While Bill Woody '03 has not yet traveled the whole globe, he has certainly answered the call to make a difference in the many communities he has served.

Following his graduation from the University of Scranton in 2011, Bill submitted an application to join the Jesuit novitiate. "Even during my times at Holy Child, the priesthood was at the back of my mind. It was never explicit, but it was always there. In getting to know the Jesuits at St. Joseph's Preparatory and at Scranton, it was this process where my interest just kept growing over time."

Bill's decision resulted in a series of moves that our foundress Cornelia Connelly would surely title an "Actions Not Words" approach to life. After his period of discernment during the novitiate, he professed vows, receiving the title of Jesuit in August 2013. From the moment Bill entered, he has assisted in campus ministry, served as a hospital chaplain in the Bronx, instructed high school Latin and Greek, ministered to the sick in a cancer hospice, and taught college philosophy...just to name a few placements. His assignments have even taken him to Jamaica, where he worked for six months in adult faith formation and as an early childhood teacher. "It's funny that I went from teaching high school Latin and Greek, to teaching kindergarten in Jamaica, and then after

that I was sent to teach college philosophy. The Jesuits have a joke, 'Join the Jesuits, see the world,'" Bill chuckled. Bill most recently taught philosophy at the College of the Holy Cross following a Master in Philosophy from Fordham University.

While Bill attended Holy Child with his three siblings (Dan '01, Mary Ann '04, and Paddy '06), Holy Child was an extension of his family. "The School was not just an institution. It was also like home. The level of care was something that you really felt from the teachers at Holy Child. There was never a teacher I couldn't approach. That was something that really marked me."

Bill's family introduced him to the Faith and made it a central focus in their family life, but faith formation, Bill said, "was inseparable from either my family or my time at Holy Child."

"I think the most important faith lesson came from the way in which the School enabled us to put into practice the motto of 'Actions Not Words.' Lynn Gosnell P'00'02'05'06 in particular helped to make this a reality—she

organized any number of programs to engage in service to others. Holy Child takes seriously the task of educating its students for service and to live out the phrase 'Actions Not Words.'"

The adventure has continued for Bill who recently moved to Boston College where he has begun a Master of Theology. He is also anticipating his ordination in June 2021. While impending ordination brings with it the anticipation of celebrating mass and confession, and many other duties, Bill's heart remains in the classroom, where he hopes to continue to live out his childhood dream of teaching. "I would love to return to teaching in higher education. There's something very special about it—being able to go a little deeper into the material. It's really a sacred time, and I've just been so privileged to be able to be involved in that." ✚

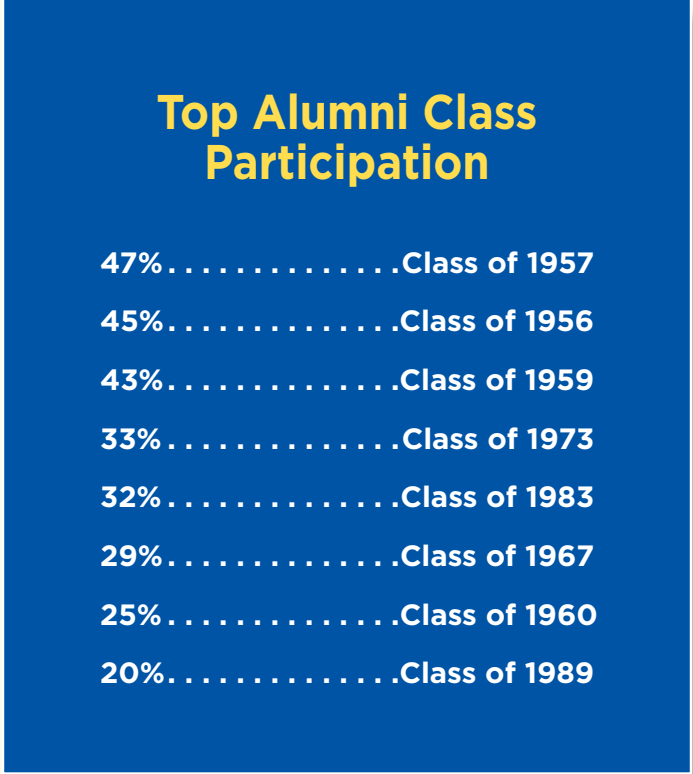
